Activity 2. Design of training modules for CSOs working in the field of migration Info Note for the CSO Participants

This training activity is organized within the scope of the Migration and Civil Society Project to enhance the technical knowledge and capacity of CSOs to contribute to policy and decision-making in the field of migration and to take part in the implementation of decisions and policies in this field.

The aim of the trainings is to contribute to the strengthening of the representatives of CSOs working in the field of migration in the areas of migration and international protection, fundraising and project development. The trainings developed for CSOs working in the field of migration will last two days in 8 provinces and will be composed of a total of 25 training activities.

Training Modules:

- The Concept of Migration and International Protection
- International legal framework on migration and international protection
- Developments in the field of migration and national legal framework on migration in Turkey
- Future perspectives on the cooperation needs in the field of migration and international protection in Turkey and open discussion on a potential CSO-public cooperation
- Fundraising and project development

Criteria for the Participation in Trainings:

- 1. CSO representatives working in associations or foundations operating in the field of migration and international protection,
- 2. CSO representatives providing services to immigrants, refugees and the victims of human trafficking,
- 3. If the requirements of item 1&2 are met, the participants will be given priority according to the order of the training application.
- 4. Representatives of the same association / foundation can participate in the training, the gender distribution among the number of participants is expected to be equal. The distribution of the participants within the scope of the trainings organized within the scope of the project is aimed to ensure the gender balance.
